

Tennis Court Container Gardening

Container gardens will be permitted on the tennis court for the 2012 season. Containers will be removable and will not damage the surface of the court. Use of the tennis court may be restored in the future if there is little demand for container gardening.

Containers:

Association members who wish to participate are responsible for providing their own container. Containers should be 1 foot deep, and elevated on legs 1 foot off the tennis court surface. Container area can be up to 4 feet x 8 feet. Containers should be built of dimensional lumber and/or plywood. (An example design is attached, but there are many ways to build a container.) *Make sure your container will fit through the gate in the fence around the court!*

Containers must be supported on legs, to prevent damage to the tennis court surface. Containers must be marked to identify ownership.

Spaces:

Spaces are awarded first-come, first-served basis to association members who have finished, ready-to-plant containers. Call Kristy at Snow's Management (563-8333) when your container is ready. Association members may transfer responsibility for containers to other members, if they no longer wish to use their container. Records of ownership will be kept by Snow's Management.

Use and Maintenance:

Containers and surrounding areas are to be kept in safe and neat condition.

Gardening hours are 9am to 9pm, May through September.

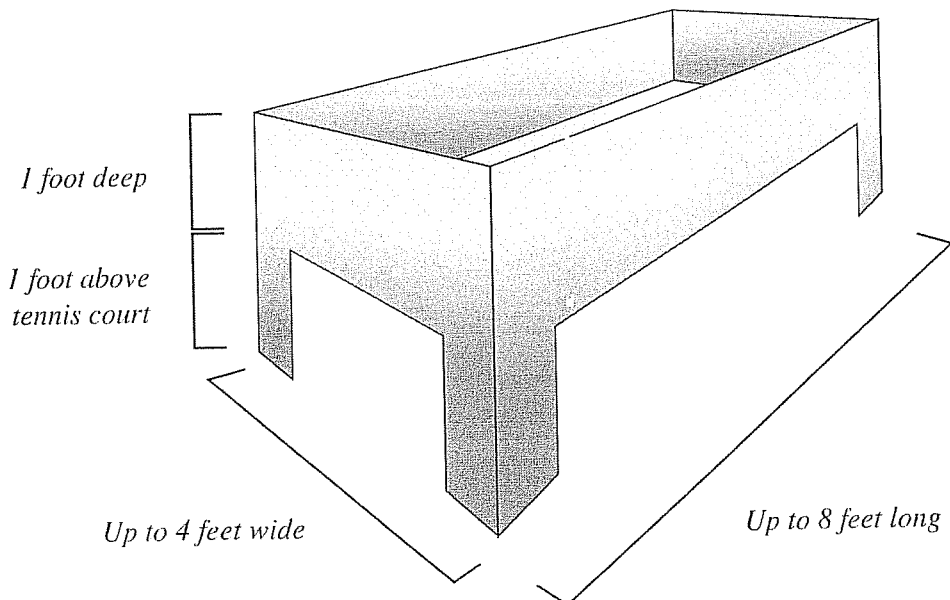
Gardening tools may be stored directly under a container.

Neglected or unsafe containers will be removed at the expense of the responsible association member. Members shall have 10 days notice prior to removal.

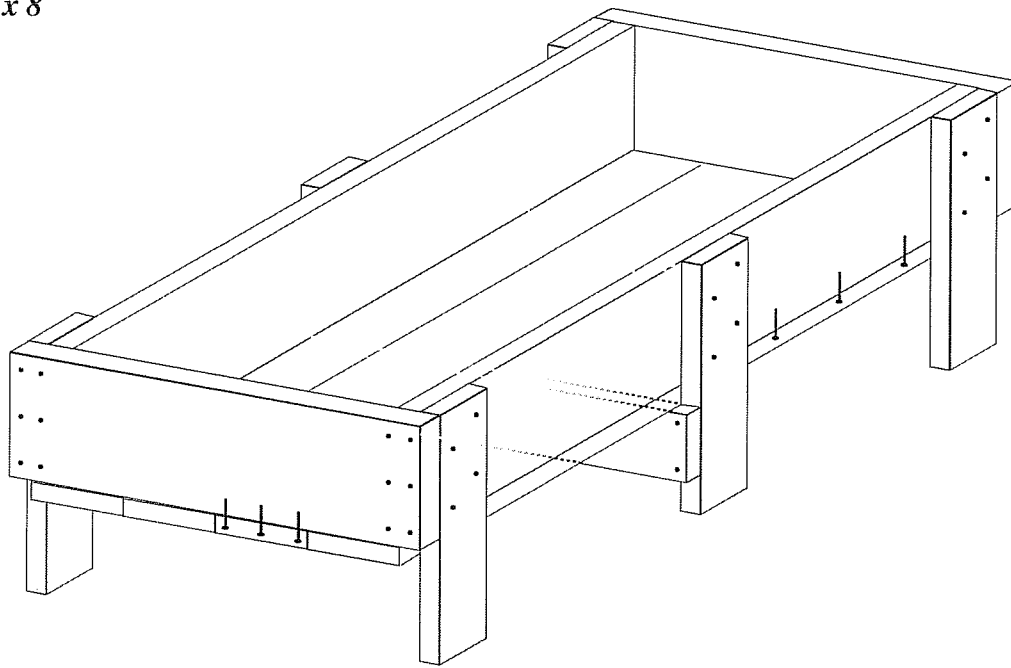
At the end of the growing season, containers must be cleared of all dead plants.

Water must be transported to the tennis court area; there is no source of water at the court.

Please use caution when moving planters and equipment between the net and the fence. The passage is obstructed by wires supporting the net.
